**AN ORDINANCE TO PURSUE METHODS TO REDUCE THE  
VOLUME OF SOLID WASTE AND ENVIRONMENTALLY  
APPROPRIATE WAYS TO DISPOSE THE REMAINDER**

**THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS WILL ASSIST THE CITY IN THE  
MAINTAINANCE OF THESE GOALS:**

- A. Plastic bags, used for carry out in retail businesses, shall be prohibited
- B. Aluminum cans shall be recycled. The City of Fort Yukon, Inc. will designate a center for the receiving of cans.

**This Ordinance becomes effective upon its adoption by the City Council;  
local retailers have 30 days to comply.**

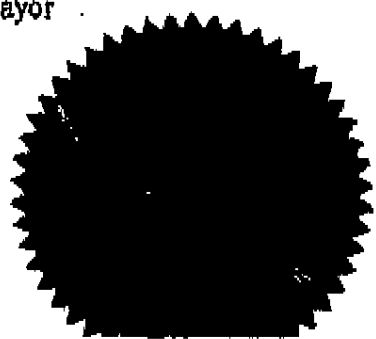

## Resolution 97-27

TITLE: A resolution to support a Fort Yukon Recycling Program.

WHEREAS, The tribal chiefs and council is the duly elected and authorized legal governing body of a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized as Native Village of Fort Yukon under the provisions of Section 16 (48 Stat. 984) of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, as amended by the Act of June 15, 1935 (49 Stat. 378), the Act of May 1, 1936 (49 Stat. 1250), and the Act of November 1, 1988 (102 Stat. 2938); and

WHEREAS, the City Landfill has been overflowing with numerous recyclable items for years; and

WHEREAS, reducing harmful chemicals, solid and hazardous wastes, toxic substances will ensure the safety and health of community members; and

WHEREAS, fewer dump sites or land fill will prevent fewer underground and surface water pollution; and

WHEREAS, the aluminum and plastic bags are recyclable items; and

WHEREAS, the NVFY Environmental Department proposes to develop a viable recycle program for the community of Fort Yukon.

NOW BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Native Village of Fort Yukon Tribal Council fully supports the development of a Recycle Program in Fort Yukon.
